- I am leading an investigation of the supports, challenges and needs of non-tenured academic professionals, including differences by appointment type and by gender. In fall 2018, I led a two-phase mixed-methods investigation. In phase one, seven (7) focus groups were conducted with 67 non-tenured academic professionals (stratified by appointment type: specialists/librarians, fixed term, and tenure stream) to identify initial themes. In phase two, using six (6) overarching themes/areas identified in the focus groups, an online survey was developed and completed by 530 non-tenured academic professionals at MSU (62.76% female; 24.85% non-White) (of 1321 invited, for a response rate of 40.1%). A report summarizing findings is guiding the redesign of supports for academic professionals.
